Greetings...I am writing you on behalf of Federal Inmate ALICE MARIE JOHNSON #14873-076.

My professional name is Kene Holliday. I am an actor, director, writer and educator. Currently I am the Founding Artistic Director of MOTO THEATRE WORKS...DALLAS, a community oriented theatre company that develops written works of the membership for stage production. I first met inmate Alice M. Johnson 17 years ago while participating in a prison ministry outreach conducted by then Evangelist Linda Holliday (I've Been Chosen Ministries).

Over the years of Ms. Johnson's incarceration, I have found her to be an encouraging and creative source of joy and positivity for all who have had the good fortune to interact with her. I have included her musings and poetry in my theatre company's stage presentations. Her submissions, though factual about the pathos of her circumstance, are amazingly free of rancor. They dwell upon her positive outlook and faith that the wrong she has suffered will imminently be resolved and she will once again know freedom.

Alice M. Johnson has shared the gift of her soul at peace with multitudes of fellow inmates and many have benefited Psychologically from participating in her workshops and performances of dance, spoken word and evangelistic ministries.

These accomplishments become more outstanding when one becomes familiar with the integral circumstances of her adjudication, consequent outlandish sentence (especially when considered against contemporary sentencing considerations for first offense violation and monetary issues dwarfed by the recent Wall Street abuses) and a questionable acuity of legal platform during her appeal process.

It is time for someone to care and be fair. It is time for CLEMENCY...
